Faith Speaks

Life is not a picnic. I think I first learned that when I moved out on my own and realized I actually had to pay someone to pick up my trash. Life was "stinky" for those first few weeks. The truth is life is difficult, filled with obstacles, struggle, loss, and trial and error. And that's just the things we can see. Consider the Apostle Paul's words in Ephesians. "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places" (Ephesians 6:12)

While we may think that the hardest struggles in life are paying bills, fights with friends, or stinky garbage, in actuality, our greatest struggles are with things we don't see. Satan, the ruler of this world, is described as the "prince of the power of the air" (Eph. 2:2). The course of this world - the schemes, ploys, infatuations, and agendas of this world are set by evil cosmic forces, the Apostle Paul says. We live in a world that is bent toward darkness, towards destruction. We live in a culture blindness. death and

In other words, according to God's word, life is a spiritual BATTLE, not a picnic. And since we find ourselves in such a battle, the scriptures implore us to dress ourselves for war. In Ephesians 6:10-18 Paul famously tells us to put on the whole armor of God so that we might stand against the schemes of the devil. Now. Paul did write Ephesians while being chained to a Roman guard. Because of this, most commentators have said that the different pieces of armor Paul describes probably corresponded to the armor of the soldiers he saw all day. However, it's better to say that the armor of the soldiers he saw all day RE-MINDED him of a different armor mentioned in the Old Testament.

In Isaiah 11:5, the "Belt of Truth" is a belt of faithfulness that the root of Jesse, the Messiah - Jesus, wears. (Faithfulness translated as "truth" in the Greek Old Testament). In Isaiah 59:17, the "Breastplate of Righteousness" and the "Helmet of Salvation" are worn by the Lord himself because he can find no man to do justice and bring salvation. In Isaiah 52:7. we have that famous passage: "How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news." This is obviously what Paul has in mind when he says, "As shoes for your feet put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace."

In multiple places in the Old Testament, the Lord himself is described as a shield for those who take refuge in him (Gen. 15:1; Prov. 30:5; Psalm 91:4-5; Psalm 5:12). Finally, there is the sword of the Spirit, which Paul says is the Word of God. He says that because in Isaiah 49:2, the prophet says that God has put his own words in him and that he has made his

mouth sharp like a sword.

So, the armor of God for Paul is more accurately God's own armor. It's the armor the Lord wears in the Old Testament. What does that mean? It means that when Paul tells us to PUT ON this armor, he's not telling us to just BE righteous, or BE truthful, or BE faithful. Really, what Paul is imploring of us is to put on God himself -HIS righteousness, HIS truthfulness, HIS faithfulness, HIS salvation! Romans 13:14: "Put on the Lord Jesus Christ." In other words, how do we defend ourselves against Satan, against the cosmic spiritual darkness of this world? We don't fight in that battle by doing the fighting ourselves. No, we fight in that battle like Israel fought in the battle against Goliath. How did Israel defeat Goliath and stand victorious on the battlefield? They trusted in their David, their valiant warrior who fought the fight for them. Beloved, Christ is our David. And Christ fights for us. If we want to be victorious in the true struggles of this life, we need to learn to trust in him for all things because life is no picnic; it's a battle. But, it's a battle that the LORD will surely win.




From the Pastor's Shelf ...

The Session reviewed the congregation's care needs and prayed for each need.


Summer Saturday's game and movie night ideas were discussed, and the new kitchen committee was established.

UPDATE FROM JENNY COON

Marhaba!

I was walking up the hill to go to a church service last night and to my surprise, I saw a patient of mine with her granddaughter struggling up the same hill in front of me. I had invited her to church a month ago, but I knew that it was still nearly impossible due to her mobility level. She told me ever since then, she tries every week to get just a little bit farther up the hill and one day, she will make it! This patient is not yet a believer, and we have had many very challenging conversations, so I was very encouraged to see her make this very physical effort to find answers for what her heart is seeking.

Thank you for your prayers for Balassan Clinic with our staffing shortages and the extra work that I have taken on. After a few "trial and errors" we have restructured a little and hopefully found the right combination with one and possibly two new hires. I appreciate your prayers for this transition time for us and for unity for our staff as well as the director and myself. At Balassan, we have expanded our partnership with one of the organizations that work with migrant/domestic workers and one of their patients recently messaged us how thankful she was for how our staff prayed with her, calmed her when she received a difficult diagnosis for her son, coordinated with the surgeon and hospital, and how she saw love and faith in every interaction. At my second clinic, Shaffi, our visiting ministry has expanded to include a speech therapist that has helped us with a couple of patients. We have had some very difficult cases with our visiting ministry this past month (attempted suicide, newly diagnosed ALS patient, etc) so I appreciate your prayers for wisdom in how best to minister to them.

This weekend my church sent a team for the third time to Syr (the same original two ladies and now a third one) to minister to a church we have been partnering with in one of the earthquake-hit regions. I will share some of the pictures below. Thank you for those who have given and prayed for this work. It is encouraging for me to pray with them before/ after they go, and hear the stories of how God is multiplying their "mustard seed" of faith to strengthen their walks with Christ. It is a unique position where I feel I am both "sent" and now a "sender" at the same time.

The big news in my life is that I have moved into a new apartment! I can not express enough how thankful I am for how God has blessed me with this new space. It is close enough to my old neighborhood that I am still close proximity to the people I do ministry with and does not really change my routine, however far enough away that I can feel "safer."

Thank you for your prayers and encouragement and for all those who reached out after my last letter.
