Faith Speaks

One time at a church staff meeting, all of us were sitting around waiting to start, and someone asked, "Hey, what's your favorite book of the Bible?" **Everyone took turns** answering. I think I said Hebrews or something. It's hard for me to stick to my favorites. But I'll never forget the answer of a very sweet custodian lady. She said, "You know, I just read the gospels and the New Testament. I can't stand the Old Testament. It's too confusing!" People were nodding along and waiting for the next answer, but I was flabbergasted.

How can someone "not stand" the Old Testament? Sadly, there are Christians today and even some pastors that have decided to "unhitch themselves" from the Old Testament. They will claim it's outdated, it's been fulfilled, it's been replaced. They forget that the Old Testament was Paul's Bible. It was Jesus' Bible! When they quoted the "scriptures," they were quoting the Old Testament. And nowhere are we told that the Old Testament is done or replaced. In fact, we are told the opposite by Jesus himself. "For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished" (Matt. 5:18).

I think the frustration some may have with the Old Testament is that they don't understand how to read it and how it fits in with the grand overarching narrative of the Bible. Starting at the end of July, we will move out of the Gospel of Mark on Sunday mornings and into the Old Testament prophecy of Jonah. Let's talk about some helpful tips for reading the left side of our Bibles to get us geared up for a new adventure in an old book.

Tip #1 ... Look for Jesus because it's all about him! On the road to Emmaus. the resurrected Jesus came up beside two confused disciples and helped them to see how all of the writings of Moses and the prophets were pointing to Christ (Luke 24:27). It's easy to look at the Old Testament and think it's all ancient history, record keeping, and poetry. But God is actually telling a story through all that history, a story about how his Son will one day come to right every wrong, defeat death, rescue his people and make all things new. Now, this doesn't mean that every single verse contains some hidden meaning about Christ, but every passage is ultimately telling the story that leads to Christ.

Tip #2 ... The New Interprets the Old. The Apostle Peter tells us that "no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:21). By in large, the Old

Testament writers and prophets understood what they were writing. However, there were many things that they did not understand fully. For example, when Isaiah wrote about the suffering servant carrying the iniquities of God's people, he could not have known that this would be an actual man, Jesus, God incarnate. And when Abraham was told by God that through him, all of the nations of the world would be blessed, he probably did not have in mind that God would one day make spiritual born-again children of Abraham from every tribe, nation, and tongue, not just the Israelites. But, because we have the New Testament. we can see how God has chosen to fulfill his promises. So, when you're reading the Old Testament and come across something confusing, look in your modern Bibles for a crossreference in the New Testament. What was unclear in the Old Covenant is made clearer in the New Covenant.

Tip #3 ... Take big bites. So many today want to have devotions where they come away with a small nugget, a verse, or even half a verse that speaks to them. If you read Proverbs, you'll definitely get that. That's kind of the point of proverbs bite-sized wisdom. But the rest of the Old Testament is not meant to be read that way.

The historical books are filled with grand sweeping narratives, and many of the minor prophets are meant to be Old Testament epistles - letters written to a group of people. If you're hunting and pecking your way through the Old Testament, it's going to get confusing and annoying fast. Instead, read whole narratives. Wrap your mind around the stories of the Old Testament, so you can more easily piece them together.

I hope those tips help you. Remember, every word of God is profitable and useful, and inspired. Let's feast upon the whole counsel of His Word. Amen.


