Faith Speaks

In the first message I gave from the book of Jonah, I mentioned that Jonah is a very different prophetic book from the others in the Old Testament. The main difference is that the book of Jonah focuses on the messager rather than the message. But another significant difference is that Jonah is a book chockfull of miracles!

There is the obvious one about a fish swallowing a man, but that's just one of many! We also see God do the following: hurl a great wind to cause a storm at sea, cause the fish to vomit up Jonah, cause a plant to grow and provide shade, cause a worm to eat the plant, and cause a scorching east wind to blow. You could almost retitle this book: "Jonah and the Many Miracles"

But, what is a miracle? In the 18th century, the Scottish skeptic and naturalist philosopher, David Hume, attacked the very concept of the miraculous by positing that unless an event can be proven possible through science and natural law, then it should not be taken seriously. Hume's ideas have stampeded through our culture and educational systems. Today, if you were to visit almost any college campus and ask professors and students alike, "Do you believe in miracles?" the majority answer you would receive would almost certainly be something akin to, "No, I believe in science."


But are science and the mi-

raculous really opposed to each other? As Christians. we believe God is the Creator. the maker of all things. And under the umbrella of "all things," we would say that God has created the laws of nature. Gravity, relativity, entropy, thermodynamics - we observe a consistency in all these things that says to us, as Christians, that there must be some intelligent designer behind these truths. As well we would say that God also has performed miracles events that seem to supersede the laws of nature.

Now, skeptics, like Hume, would argue that it's all well and good to think there is a god who designed everything, including the natural laws. However, the skeptic says we should not think that this god bypasses the laws of nature because then they would cease to be laws we could trust. To-"progressive Chrisday, tians" or "naturalistic Christians" who want to follow after Hume will sav that they believe in God, but they don't believe he does miracles. For the progressive Christian, all the miracles in scripture are simply allegories meant to teach us some other lesson.

C.S. Lewis battled these ideas in his day in his book, simply titled "Miracles." Lewis states the biblically obvious. "If we admit God, must we admit miracle? Indeed. Indeed, you have no security against it. That is the bargain."

Lewis and many other scholars and philosophers have pointed out the mistake in Hume's thinking. Miracles, by definition, do not break the laws of nature. Here is a great quote from Lewis to explain. "We are in the habit of talking as if (the laws of nature) have caused events to happen; but they have never caused any event at all. The laws of motion do not set billiard balls moving. The laws analyze the motion after something else (say a man with a cue) has provided it ... A miracle, therefore, is emphatically not an event without cause or without results. Its cause is the activity of God: its results then follow according to natural law." (continued on page 2)

Lewis' definition of miracles perfectly aligns with what we see in the book of Jonah. A great wind that causes a storm at sea is not a breaking of the natural law, but it is a miracle if it is God who hurls that wind in such a way and at such a time that we wouldn't naturally expect the wind. A plant could naturally grow tall enough to provide shade, but it is miraculous if God appoints the plant to do so for a purpose or at a time we would not normally expect. The same is true of the worm, and the same is true of the fish! Miraculously God can use the laws of nature to make a fish big enough to swallow a man and its internal conditions so that man could survive for three days.

So, let's abandon the notion that science and the miraculous are opposed to each other. As the Psalmist says, "Whatever the Lord pleases, he does, in heaven and on earth, in the seas and all deeps." (Psalm 135:6) ... and he does so in accordance with the very rules He created.

UPDATE FROM

THE KIM'S



This February 2023 during the RMC Conference in Guebwiller, France Achimede was given the opportunity to share about the Life School (Graine de Maisha) project that is giving students in the southeast side of the island of Mayotte a chance to receive a lifechanging, Christian education. Despite the 2 hour commute where Archimede and his wife live on the northwest side of the island, he is committed to moving closer to the school this summer where he can teach and eventually become the school director. It is important to know this school is run by Samuel and Anne Vernaz, two Swiss, Christian pediatricians who have a vision to see this school impact the poorest area of the island where over 5,000 children have no opportunity to attend school. It was during his speech that I (Jeff) was convicted by the incredible need on this French island territory of Mayotte between Madagascar and Mozambique. Even more, I saw this guy as a future leader of this school project.

Last week, my convictions were confirmed during a 2 hour Zoom with the Vernaz couple when they shared their desire to see Archimede become the future school director. It was amazing to hear their perspective independently of mine own convictions after meeting him. Last Friday, I had a Zoom with Archimede to get to know him better and hear of his plans to move closer to the school where he will continue his university studies in order to become a school director. Because Mayotte is a French outer-lying territory, they are governed by the same French administrative requirements as the nation of France. This means he needs to finish his Bachelor's degree to a school director position.

EducaVie will start investing in Archimede's growth and development by offering a scholarship that will finance the remainders of his studies. Our plan will be to train teachers as well in Christian world-view perspectives using a new book that EducaVie recently endorsed called the Visual Valet written by Harold Klassen. This is a great work that enables

teachers to incorporate the main themes of a Christian-world view perspective (Creation, Fall, Redemption, Structure/ Direction). We will also engage in a fundraising project incorporating their need into our overall budget to dig a well in the neighborhood where more than 5,000 children and adults live in the poorest section of the island. Currently, they survive on bottled water and rainwater captured in large plastic run off containers. Can you imagine the impact of digging a well where children and families can have fresh water in the neighborhood of the school, as well as raise up a school director that will lead this Christian School forward in the years to come ?

Below is a photo of the school staff of the Life School (Graine de Maisha) in the Mayotte language with Archimede holding a baby in his arms next to Dr. Samuel Vernaz, the current school director and his wife, Dr. Anne Vernaz. Would you pray for Archimede who plans to move from his family's neighborhood closer to the Life School and University where he can start his studies this fall ? Would you pray for the Lord to raise up individuals or an organization who will invest in the 25,000 USD for the digging of this well ?

Last week, our EducaVie team assembled from different corners of France for our annual team retreat. This was a chance for each of us to develop deeper relationships by spending time meditating on God's word as we studied Isaiah 30:15-28 together, we had an official board meeting, and took time to reflect on what

God enabled us to do this past year as we look to the projects that are developing for 2023-2024. Our team had the privilege of welcoming new team members from Lyon and Pierrelatte. This week, we will receive another family that arrives from Oregon who will be teaching at BFA (German side) and at the Collège Daniel (Guebwiller, Alsace). We welcomed Nicolas Laurent who joined our retreat as or personal chef, a long-time friend of our board treasurer, Jean-Marc Grisot. We were able to sample two evening meals that Nicolas prepared for our team, what a treat!

Nicolas will be joining Jeff as they travel to the southeast USA for two weeks late September to bring a "taste of France" to certain fund raising dinners our France Champions will be hosting. We are excited about what the Lord is doing through EduaVie and the plans we have as we will be launch a bimonthly podcast to our French network of Christian Schools as well as help in the development of several new school projects in France and in the Congo and Mayotte.

Please take a minute to thank the Lord for the good meeting of our board president, Jérôme Garnier who spoke to a group of 9 churches in the Basque Country mid-June. He has been invited back to speak later this fall to continue vision casting amidst these churches that are engaging in more meaningful relationships with non-Christian families in their region as they look to start a Christian school in Tarnos, France.



Would you pray for the 8 to 10 French dinners confirmations that Jeff is putting into place across the southeastern USA to raise funds for EducaVie's operational costs as well as one-time projects during the last two weeks of September ?
