Faith Speaks

I couldn't escape. I ran around the ring, out of breath; my legs were tired, and I couldn't hold my guard up. My instructor yelled from the sidelines, "Don't run, John. Learn!" I was a brown belt in Tae Kwon Do, and my instructor had been putting me up in sparring matches against black belts much better than me. He told me at the start, "You're not going to win, but that's the point. I want them to expose your weaknesses. That's the only way you'll learn."

There are a lot of things in life you simply cannot outrun; you must face them and let them reveal the chinks in your armor. And none of those predators is more deadly or more necessary than the word of God. Consider these words from Hebrews 4:12-13 - "For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account."

This passage presents to us scripture as a scalpel in the hands of God, our master surgeon. Notice the first two descriptions of God's word: living and active. I've read many novels that made me think. made me cry, or made me angry, but every book I've ever read shares this same quality: If I put it down, I don't have to deal with it. Not so with the living and active word of God.

You can refuse to read the Bible, but you'll still hear it. You'll hear it referenced in movies, books, magazines, you name it. You'll hear God's word preached and taught. You'll hear it discussed and debated. God's word also has the ability to stick with you years later in your mind and heart. Multiple New Testament authors refer to the word as a seed that is planted in us. James calls it the "implanted word, which is able to save (James your souls" 1:21). Peter calls it the abiding "living and word of God" (I Peter 1:23). The point is you can't outrun God's word. You can't just put it down. There is no other scripture of any religion that you are forced to think about or reckon with.

But the truths

down to the marrow, to our souls and spirit, it's getting down to the truth of who we are, what we think, what we feel, what we believe. And that's a good thing! You want that, Christian! You want God to see the real you now so he can transform you into what you're really supposed to be. cludes by saying that our God, holding this piercing scalpel, sees all. We are all naked and exposed before him, and it is to him we must give an account. Dear reader, this year, you God's Word because you cannot escape your God. He is calling you to repentance, calling you to service, calling you to understand his will, calling you to have (continued on page 2)

For the following, pray for health, comfort and fellowship with God during a period of sickness, that the Lord will give them faith, patience, joy and submission to his will.







"Taking God at His Word" - Kevin DeYoung

Most Christians can tell you that the Bible is important, and if you were to ask them why, they would probably say something like, "because it's helpful" "because it helped me." But, the Bible should have our trust for more than just its ability to speak wisdom into difficult circumstances. The Bible is authoritative, it's sufficient, it's clear, it's true and it's even necessary.

In this succinct and witty little book, Kevin DeYoung gives the reader a foundational understanding of the theology of scripture. Presently, our world is very confused as to how to think about scripture – what it is and what it means. DeYoung does an excellent job of clearing the air and showing us how we can trust the Bible.

This is a great book to read, but also a great book to hand out to those friends and family who are confused as to why we say the Bible is "God's inspired Word." We have some copies in our church bookstore. I highly recommend you pick one up!

Surely we only have to be realistic and honest with ourselves to know how regularly we need to turn to the Bible. How often do we face problems, temptation, and pressure? **Every day!** Then how often do we need instruction. guidance and greater encouragement? Every day! To catch all these felt needs up into an even greater issue, how often do we need to see God's face, hear his voice, feel his touch. know his power? The answer to all these questions is the same: every day!

UPDATE FROM GEORGIA RIGHT TO LIFE

NEW YEAR'S GREETINGS!

"Out with the OLD and in with the NEW." We hear that phrase quite often. In terms of what Georgia Right to Life is doing we continue moving forward into 2024 with the same goal - to protect and preserve the sanctity of innocent human life, from earliest beginning until natural death!

We look forward with anticipation to see how God will use the challenges and experiences ahead in 2024 to expand our organization and increase our faith in Him.

Georgia Right to Life 2023 Accomplishments Your support and prayers have

enabled us to accomplish a lot during calendar year 2023:

- *College campus visits to speak directly with students and educate them on the nature of preborn human life. We also staffed booths and tables, and held speaking engagements at conferences, fairs, schools, and churches.
- *Running billboards that get millions of views in a month's time. We have messages running now in Atlanta and Augusta. The billboards offer help for those in an unplanned pregnancy and encouragement to save their babies.
- *Digital ads that target the smartphones of young teens and

women in Georgia. These ads are getting three to four times the industry average in clicks to the Teenbreaks.com website – a site loaded with true facts. Over 250,000 people per month receive the ads! Overall, thousands have responded.

*Pro-Life Bridges Across Georgia: We've taken our message to Georgia highways and reached hundreds of thousands as we've held large signs on bridge overpasses over I-285, I-85, I-75, I-985, GA 400 and other highways across Georgia.

*Chapter activities around the state engage the public and uphold the sanctity of life. An example: Hall County Right to Life teaches about the origin of life and the birth process to multiple grades in Hall County public-schools every year. GRTL produced monthly e-newsletters on current developments, events and aspects of the life-related battles.

*Radio spots Monday – Friday on 31 radio stations in portions of five states. GNNradio.org. Tune in at 3:15pm on your smartphone or laptop. At 3:17pm our spot is played with fifteen different topics related to life issues.

*Annual Memorial Service commemorating the loss of more than 64 million children who have been denied the Godgiven right to life.

*Annual Oratory and Video Contests are conducted initially at the local county chapter level which culminates in a statewide competition.

*With Georgians Ending Abortion, promoted HR 413 - The

Georgia Personhood Amendment, and HB 496 - the Georgia Prenatal Equal Protection Act (GA-PEPA) now in committee in the Georgia Legislature. And much more!


