I have raked in more stump holes than I care to count. As a teenager, father owned my а stump grinding business, and rather than let me get a job at McDonald's, Dad put me to work. He paid me, though - ten bucks an hour! Which was a good wage for any back teenager then. Now, don't get me wrong, I cherish those memories of working with my father, but I did not love the work. It was grueling hot afternoons in the sun, and even though I was getting paid, I often dreaded home coming from school to hear my father say, "Get your boots on, we've got a job."

I was reflecting on all this just this past year when a bunch of us church members were outside working on the playground. If you participated, you know that was grueling work, as well. Whether it was holding heavy poles in place, shoveling dirt, or building scaffolding, we were all sweaty and tired by the end of the day. But, strangely, I enjoyed it. In fact, I think all of us did. And here's the interesting thing, none of us were getting paid!

So, why is that? Why

is it that the work for which we get paid can become so unenjoyable, but the work for which we volunteer can feel so fulfilling? The answer is purpose.

In Colossians, Paul gives the Church an important lesson about work and service. He addresses bondservants - slaves. These were men and women who, because they were in debt, had no choice but to work off their debt by becoming servants to a master. He tells these bondservants Colossians this in 3:22, "Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, people-pleasers, as but with sincerity of fearing heart. the Lord. Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men. knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ."

You see, when it comes to work, we normally don't have the freedom to just change our job change the work. We

may not be able to change WHAT we're doing, but we can change WHO we're doing that work FOR. We can change the purpose of our work. Money is a fickle master. If we choose to work for its pleasure alone, we will only find ourselves being upset that it hasn't changed our lives as much as we'd hoped. But God is our creator. When we choose to work for his pleasure and his glory, no matter what the task, there can be fulfillment.

I am bringing all of this up, beloved, because I want to remind you that as a Christian, you are in service to the Lord. Whatever your occupation, whether it's running a company, loading boxes. answering phones, being a stay-at-home parent, or even just volunteering within the **Church (Continued on** page 2)



"Holy Subversion" - Trevin Wax

Serving God in our world can be a tricky thing. Jesus knew that; he even promised it when he said, *"In this world you WILL have trouble, but take heart I have overcome the world"* (John 16:33).

In this helpful little book, author Trevin Wax explores how God wants us to approach serving him in the hostile age we find ourselves in. The answer Wax draws out from scripture is not that we should avoid the world or hide from it but that we should subvert it. As the Christian lives for Christ in all he does, he ought to live a life that subverts expectations and counterruns cultural. His love should be remarkably different and strange. His giving should be different. His free time should be different.

Wax explores several life topics in this way, providing many judicious insights and aptly identifying the idols of our time that keep us from serving God as we ought. If you're looking for a quick read that will challenge you to examine your approach to the everyday, this is a book you should pick up.

I looked at my schedule for the day and saw that my first three patients were all widows. "Susan" is slowly losing her eyesight and we are currently trying to help her with funds for some surgery. Walking is very difficult for her because of her eyesight and her severely bent spine, and yet she tells me her goal in therapy is to be able to continue to walk up the hill to church every Friday and Sunday with a steadfast faith that inspires me sometimes. "Jamila" recently lost her son to cancer and is in tears most of the time I see her. She worries about her remaining son as he suffered a head injury and has never fully recovered. "Nada" is alone as her son and daughter live overseas and she loves to use our time together to tell me stories about her village in the south and their olive trees. Olive trees that will not be producing fruit this year due to the war... "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress" James 1:27

I have dreams for what I want our clinic to be. I want us to be able to help fulfill the vision of the local church. I want to see us expand in Lebanon and then in Syria. But some days, the task is simple. It's caring for the widows like these precious ladies that are in front of me. Loving them, weeping with them, laughing with them, and praying their comfort would abound through Christ.


Join with me in praying for the widows this month. The widows from the war in Syria, the war in Gaza, and the ones here in my community.
