Faith Speaks

When I was a teenager, I helped move a really large heavy icebox. I held my end with one hand and reached for a door handle with my other hand ... and POP... I felt something give in my back. Shooting pain! I immediately dropped the box and hunched over, feeling like I shouldn't even dare move or it would get worse. The chiropractor told me later that I had pulled some rib heads out and that, unfortunately, I was probably going to feel those little buggers slip out again from time to time for the rest of my life. How reassuring.

I was telling this story to a brother, and naturally, he told me all about his own physical ailments and issues. We both remarked, as Christian men want to do in these conversations, "Can't wait for the resurrection and that new body!"

Now, I know I'm too young to be talking like this. Apologies. But this is something I think a lot of us are familiar with - that longing for the return of Christ when we will be raised into a new body that is done away with death and all our aches and pains. Amen!

Maranatha! Jesus, come soon!

But, as we are longing for that future physical resurrection, let's not forget that, as Christians, we have already been given a spiritual resurrection. In Colossians 3, Paul says we have been "raised with Christ". In that chapter, Paul describes how we ought to live as spiritually resurrected children of God. What is somewhat ironic is that he actually uses our bodies as an illustration of how we should live this resurrected life, even though we have only been spiritually resurrected and not yet physically resurrected.

First, he says that we should seek the things above where Christ is, and our minds should be set on the things above. In other words, our resurrected eyes and minds ought to be fixated on heaven, on Christ, on things that are grander and much more delightful than the things of this world. Next, he says that our spiritually resurrected bodies

ought to be abstaining from things like sexual immorality and impurity. He even states something so obvious. Eph. 3:6 - "On account of these things the wrath of God is coming." Why would I want my newly-made-alive self to participate in something that invites death and destruction? In verse 8, Paul says our resurrected mouths should be free from anger, wrath, malice, slander, obscene talk, and lying. And in verse 12, our resurrected selves should even be clothed appropriately with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, patience, and love.

It's so tempting, as Christians, especially when we live with debilitating ailments, to fixate on the waiting. We long to be free from this body of pain and death, but as we are longing and waiting, let's not forget (continued on page 2)







- Andrew Murray

If anyone can be said to have unlocked the devotional Christian life, Andrew Murray may have done it. A Scottish-born missionary to South Africa, the Dutch reformer Andrew Murray wrote over 240 books and tracts about Christian living and prayer. And most of those books are delightfully short and to the point. I enjoy reading Murray to refresh myself with simple bible truths. In “Living to Please God,” Murray explores the call on every Christian to live a spiritual life that honors the Lord. He answers questions like “How do I overcome sin?” “How do I know if God is happy with me?” “What is the role of the Holy Spirit in my life?” and much more. As an added bonus, Murray draws most of his practical lessons from the book of Ephesians, so it’s a great little book to read while we are in our sermon series on the same epistle.


Also, the following events were discussed and scheduled:

MEET**GRADY DAVIDSON**

Global Instructor with Timothy Two Project, International

Grady is Faith's newest missionary that we support.

Ministry: Teaching and training pastors and church leaders in the majority world, using the apostolic model taught in 2 Timothy 2:2 – “What you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses, entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also.”

His Work: Grady serves as a Global Instructor with Timothy Two Project, International. As a Global Instructor, Grady leads workshops for majority-world pastors and church leaders who have little or no formal theological education. There are four basic workshops in the T2 “Growing in Grace” curriculum, with each workshop running for around 3 days. Altogether, the four “Growing in Grace” workshops, taught in sequence six months apart, cover all the major headings of systematic theology, approximately the same as one year of theology in a typical seminary curriculum. In between the workshops, the pastors and leaders are then challenged to take the workbooks home and teach the material to their own congregations, continuing the cycle de-

scribed in 2 Timothy 2:2. As Grady enters his second year with Timothy Two Project, he is working with groups in El Salvador and Costa Rica.


Grady and Becky make their home in the beautiful community of Wildwood, just outside of Chattanooga Tennessee.
