

It's so easy when you come to the end of one of Paul's letters to just skip right past his closing remarks and greetings. Paul wrote his letters to real people in real places, and he tended to always end his letters with some personal correspondence. That correspondence can feel kind of worthless because it feels like it's not addressed to us. But to skip past the end of those epistles would be a huge mistake because the fact that the Bible is inspired means that ALL of God's word is useful to us.

Take, for example, Paul's closing remarks to the Church of Colossae about a man named Epaphras. Epaphras was a friend of Paul's who probably started the church in Colossae and then later ministered to Paul during his Roman imprisonment. At the end of Paul's letter to the Colossian Church. says this... Col. he 4:12: "Epaphras, who is one of you, a servant of Christ Jesus, greets you, struggling always on your behalf in his prayers, that you may stand mature and fully assured in all the will of God."

Now, again, it's so easy to gloss over that and think, "Right, Epaphras was a nice guy. Moving on." But wait! There's gold in that verse! Did you see it? Look at how Paul described Epaphras' prayers.

He said **Epaphras** STRUGGLED in his prayers for the Colossian Christians. That is an interesting way to describe prayer, isn't it? We've all probably thought about our own prayer " lives and said. struggle TO pray." But Epaphras was a man who struggled IN Struggle is prayer. Greek the word AGONIZOMAI. Epaphras "agonized" in his prayers. He "fought" in his prayers. When he prayed for the Colossians he was "striving and toiling" on their behalf.

can't We iust move past that. We need to pause and consider. What does that mean? What does it look like to STRUGGLE in prayer for someone or something? Just on the surface, we could simply say that struggling in prayer means I am praying as if I really think this prayer will work, it will

have an effect. You don't work or fight for something unless you actually believe in that something. This idea is echoed in James 5 : 1 6, which states, "The fervent prayer of a righteous man has great power."

But struggling and fighting (the main definitions of AGONI-**ZOMAI**) also imply there is an obstacle, an opponent - something ľm fighting against, not just someone I'm fighting for. Paul reveals to us the enemy we struggle against in Ephesians 6:12 - "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against cosmic the powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places." From this seemingly obscure little verse at the end of Paul's letter, we are reminded of this big lesson: Beloved, don't forget to struggle and fight for one another in prayer.

UPDATE FROM JENNY COON

Faith Speaks

Marhaba!

"Olive" is a 17 year old Syrian girl from the village of Ragga. During the early years of the Syrian war, she fled with her family to a neighboring village when ISIS invaded their town. When 2 close family members were killed, her father had a psychotic breakdown and left the family. At this point, a little over two years ago when she was working at home, the gas tank exploded and her body was terribly burned from her chest to her thighs. The hospital said that they did not have the medicines or equipment to treat her burns, so her mother, older sister, and nephew (a toddler) escaped to Lebanon hoping to find treatment. Initially, the United Nations was helping to provide the treatment but after funding cuts, they stopped. She came to Balassan Counseling and Medical Center due to the depression and shame she was feeling due to what she felt was her damaged and disfigured body and started seeing our Her mother and psychologist. older sister then started coming to see me for physical therapy due to chronic pain, in part from the trauma they experienced in Syria. Her young nephew also started seeing the psychologist. Over time, the Balassan staff got to know her and her family and their desperate financial situa-The mother is unable to tion. work due to her health. Olive's

older sister had struggled to find

work after her abusive husband left her taking her young son. Olive expressed a desire to find work at a salon, but was unable to afford the training fees. Our church has recently started a new project called Taj Beauty Center to help train women with some basic skills as well as be a safe/welcoming place for women in the community. We were able to get her one of the training positions and covered all of the costs. She eagerly started to train and told us how joyful it made her feel to learn a new skill that she hoped would one day provide income for her family. For the first time in a long time, she was excited about something. She has recently expressed interest in attending our church youth group as well. Pray that God would continue to reveal Himself to Olive and her family, especially during this month of Ramadan. It is not easy to be a Syrian in Lebanon and there is a lot of resentment.

"We used to ask our patients if we could pray with them. Now, our patients come to us asking for prayer." Marlene is one of our two receptionists at Balassan and the only other staff member that is also a member at our church besides myself. I challenged her at the beginning of the year to start spiritually investing in our patients (she never saw this as something "she could do") and Olive was one of her first. It has been a joy to watch her flourish in this role and take ownership of this as her ministry.

In exciting news, I will be coming back to Chicago for a short visit in the end of May! Stay tuned next month for more details! I would love to see as many of you as possible.

As always, I am so grateful for each and every one of you and how you pray, support, and encourage the ministry here in Lebanon as well as me personally.
