Faith Speaks

I've never been that great at throwing a football. I can kick one to the moon, but throwing one requires some technique I don't have. But, on that day in Kevin's front yard with lots of kids running around and yelling, enjoying the summer sun, I threw the perfect spiral. I was so amazed at how well that pig skin was flying that I didn't realize that Kevin (the friend to whom I was throwing the football) had not yet turned around. I yelled name at the last second, but it was too late. My perfect spiral made perfect contact with the back of Kevin's not-soperfect head.

Everyone laughed when Kevin was hit with my Tom Brady of a pass, and I didn't help things when I, too, laughed and said, "Dude, my bad ... but did you see that throw?!" Needless to say, Kevin was upset. He yelled at me while rubhis head bing and stormed off into the house, embarrassed and furious.

"My bad" may be an admission of guilt, but it is a far cry from the repentance we are called to have towards our sin. The word repentance in the Greek is a simple

enough term that "to change means one's mind." In fact, sometimes, that definition of repentance is used to downplay repentance as something that's not that big of a deal. It's just agreeing with God that you did wrong. But, when we look at the text of scripture, we see that repentance is a call to a way of life. The Church Father, Tertullian, once said, "I was born for no other end but to repent."

In Acts 3:19, Peter was preaching in Solomon's portico and said, "Repent therefore. and TURN BACK, that your sins may be blotted out." When Peter gives the command to repent, he clarifies that what he means is more than just changing one's mind; it's changing one's life the direction of one's life. "Turn back from what you're doing, from the life you're living, so that your sins may be blotted out." Ezekiel gives a similar command to Israel in Ezekiel 14:6, "Repent and away from your idols; turn away your faces from all your abominations."

Paul tells us in 2nd Corinthians 7:10 that there is a godly grief which produces repentance. So, in other words, repentance is not just realizing that I made a mistake; it's born from an actual sorrow over my sin and even a loathing and hatred of my sin.

What we can surmise from all of this is repentance that something that must be a gift from God, a result of him changing my heart. See, in that moment of hitting Kevin with my pass, my laughter and demeanor betrayed me. I wasn't really repentant from hitting Kevin. Was I sorry? Sure, I didn't want to hurt my friend. But, there was no sorrow; there no frustration was with myself. In fact. I was more frustrated with Kevin for making such a big deal out of it. (Continued on page 2)

Left to ourselves and our own

motivations, we will tend to excuse our sin, downplay it, and make it seem less than what it is. Left to ourselves, we won't ever truly repent. We will only hope to escape the consequences of our mistakes.

This is why we see several places in scripture where repentance, like Faith and salvation, is called a gift from God. Acts 11:8 - "Then to the Gentiles God has also granted releads that pentance life." (See also: Acts 5:31; 2 Timothy 2:25). In other words, we need the Holy Spirit's help to have our eyes opened to just how serious our sin is and just how seriously we must take it.

Beloved, is there sin in your life at which you just shrug your shoulders and say, "My bad"? Is there sin in your life that you consider not that big a deal? Are there habits that you excuse as part of your upbringing or heritage? Remember, our sin is not just a football accidentally thrown at a friend. Our sin is a serious act of violence towards the will of God. It's an affront to the nature of our creator. Ask the Lord to show you his glory and beauty. Ask him to show you the truth of your behavior. like David prayed: "Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!" (Psalm 139:23-24). Pray that the Lord would grant you repentance. Amen.

UPDATE FROM GARY AND JACKIE BURNETT

Mentors and Mentored Growing Together: Marilyn Davis (SIL International's coordinator of their trauma healing program in Latin America), on the right in the picture below, is Jackie's mentor in the Trauma Healing Institute's program and Jackie is mentoring Adriana Tapias, on the left. The three of us meet to share about the doors that God is opening and the new challenges those opportunities entail, as well as to pray together. Adriana and Jackie are now mentoring some of the women mentioned below and leading a monthly trauma healing Community of Practice meeting to support, grow, and encourage trauma healing facilitators.





Training facilitators in "Healing Children's Wounds of Trauma" in Monteria:

It is a special joy that 3 of these facilitators are teachers who come from one of the areas of armed conflict in Colombia and are working with children in their communities. We have walked alongside them for more than 7 years and they are currently part of the group that Jackie mentors to care for their own hearts and to nurture their relationship with God.



Our dear family, pastor Argemiro and his wife Karen: they have been like our children for more than 7 years. Argemiro is the pastor of the Nazareth

Presbyterian Church in Valencia

Cordoba (North Coast). They have a passion and calling to evangelize and care for the children of the villages and towns and since last year they have been working with Compassion International. Jackie has been mentoring Karen who is also an Apprentice Facilitator for the Trauma Healing ministry.



Helping without hurting children during grief:

This is the most recent topic we have been discussing in our Community of Practice. The participation of including 87 leaders, Christian psychologists and counselors, exceeded expectations. Certainly, the need to help hurting children is very great. Our guest was psychologist and Master Facilitator in trauhealing, Lesbia Gonzalez. She will continue supporting us in May with the second part of training on this topic.



Planning a Retreat and Trauma Healing Ministry for the Women of the Synod of Reformed Presbyterian

Churches of Colombia:

Doris Ramos (top left) is the leader of the women's ministries of the Reformed Presbyterian churches in the states of Choco and Antioquia, and Livys Lora (below) is the director of the synod's women's ministries in Colombia. They want to begin with the leadership retreat "When the soul become exhausted," because of the burnout that so many of the women leaders are experiencing.

We are also praying and planning with these leaders for a two-year process to establish a solid ongoing ministry of trauma healing for women. Our prayer is for the Holy Spirit to guide us as we walk alongside these sisters in Christ to grow together, become fruitful and faithful servants, and to finish the race well.



Mentoring the Process of Passing the Torch for the New Generation Foundation:

We continue mentoring the teachers who are promoting the vision and curriculum of "More than a Children's Teacher." These facilitators, from the 4 groups we have been working with, are taking the lead in multiplying the ministry among approximately 200 leaders in Colombia, Ecuador and Venezuela.

Praise and Prayer request: Thanks be to God our mother's health (Jessie and Lucy) has been stable. Jessie has applied and now waiting for approval to receive assistance from Medicaid. This will be essential for Gary to return to Colombia to be with Jackie. We are also thankful that since Jackie's return to Colombia last month, she has had time to refresh and pickup with developing new friends and ministry opportunities in the Quindio region where we now live.

- The transition to accommodate Pastor Gerardo and his family at Gary's mother's house.
- Jessie's approval for Medicaid and Gary's return to Colombia.


