# Faith Speaks

You'll notice that all of those desires were focused around occupation. I was anxious, not really about what I would BE, but what I would DO. (Save for the ninja turtle thing, but that was a phase) . The preoccupation with what we will do with our life has always been a concern of the young. Tohowever, many day. young people are not stressed out about what they will accomplish or what career they will have. For them, it's the opposite. They're concerned about who they are. They are in a crisis of identity.

There exists today so much confusion around sex and gender, but also around political identity and even racial tribalism. Those facing this identity crisis want to define themselves and even to recreate themselves (Sadly, sometimes


literally with surgery). And the constant stream of internet and social media provides a smorgasbord of temptation endless examples of what they could be.

So, what exactly is the biblical response to this? Well, there are several, actually. In fact, the issue of identity is prominent throughout the scriptures. Unfortunately, I cannot touch on every point the Bible makes in this short article, which is why I will take one sentence to encourage you to check out my book recommendation on page 3.

Here is an excellent place to start when it comes to addressing the identity with crisis scrip-Remember ture. that at the heart of sin is an inwardlooking and preoccupation with ourselves. When Satan tempts Adam and Eve, he entices them by saying that if they eat the fruit, they will be like God, knowing good and evil. Here is Satan making Adam and Eve question their identity. can almost hear the serpent whispering, "Don't you want to be more than what God made you?" "With one bite you can recreate yourself."

C.S. Lewis famously defined humility as "not thinking less of yourself, but thinking of yourself less." the Beatitudes, Jesus told us that it is the "poor in spirit" who are blessed. By poor in spirit, he meant those who can honestly evaluate their spirits and realize their own spiritual bankruptcy—their need for a savior.

You when see. someone is obsessed with their identity in capacity, what they are really obsessed with is not discovering a truth outside o f themselves. They are not noble explorers. They obsessed with themselves. They are attempting to recreate themselves - to be the God of their own (Continued on page 2)







We don't need to be hidden in a sexuality or hidden in another body or a particular affiliation. We must be hidden in Christ! Let me end with Paul's encouragement to the Church in Colossae. "Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory." (Colossians 3:2-4).

He has spent much of his life teaching scripture to young people, and it shows. "Who Am I?" is very straightforward and aims in every way to shed light on this topic for the modern reader. Martyn does a surprisingly thorough job of applying scripture to our current generation's identity crisis on multiple levels. And he does so firmly but graciously, with an evangelistic voice throughout.

#### Marhaba!

A warm welcome to those of you who are new to this newsletter that I have met over this past month back in the States! My heart is full as I prepare to return to Lebanon in less than a week. I have felt so loved, supported, and encouraged in these weeks that I have been back that the only word I keep repeating in my head is grateful.

One of the neat things that happened while I was back was re-connecting with a dear Syrian refugee family that I did ministry with for several years in Beirut that got re-settled to Salt Lake City six months ago. They are Muslim-background believers and were eager to get started in a church in America, however with the language/cultural barriers they were finding it difficult. prayed God would lead us to the right community and found a small community church nearby. I helped a little with introductions and translations and then a few church members took it from there and they have gone every Sunday since then!

Balassan clinic has continued on in my absence and most notably hosted a social support group sponsored by the Red Cross for moms with children under the age of 5 that has been a huge encouragement for these moms.

I'll send a more detailed update after I get back, but I wanted to welcome our newcomers and thank you all for a refreshing trip back to the States. I honestly was struggling a little with the good-byes and thought of leaving, when I talked with my Syrian friend in Salt Lake City yesterday who reminded me "Yes, I know it is hard to leave your family, but you need to go and be a light to all those who are tired in Lebanon and God will strengthen you."

Thank you to each and every one of you and how you pray, support, and encourage the ministry here in Lebanon as well as me personally. I could not do it without you!
