I want to highlight another significant theologian from the Reformation. In fact, one could argue that, next to Martin Luther, this man is the most well-known reformer. I'm speaking, of course, about John Calvin.

Most people know John Calvin as the namesake for the theological position known as Calvinism. Calvin, of course, was a pastor, writer, and thinker who wrote volumes upon volumes, including the first systematic theology book of the Reformation. the "Institutes of the Christian Religion." Calvin is usually understood as this sort of stuffy French professor who started a somewhat controversial way of thinking about salvation and God's electing grace.

However, what most people don't realize is that John Calvin was one of the greatest missionaries and church planters in the history of Christendom. This may come as a shock to many because one of the common criticisms that is leveled at Calvinists is that our view of God's sovereignty in salvation renders evangelism unnecessary. Therefore, there are some who actually say that Calvinists don't evangelize. Well, don't say that to John Calvin!

In one of Calvin's sermons, titled "The Call to Witness," he says, "If the gospel be not preached, Jesus Christ is, as it were, buried ... Let us not deceive lesus Christ in the testimony we owe Him, by stopping our mouths, when it is needful to maintain His honor, and the authority of His gospel." It was passionate preaching such as this from Calvin that stirred the hearts of many French refugees in Geduring neva the 1550's. These refugees yearned to return to France and preach the saving gospel. What was Calvin's response to their evangelistic fer-He offered to vor? train them before they went.

Calvin's missionary school in Geneva had over 1,500 students within its first five years, and at least 100 of those students became missionaries to France. A couple of pastors were even sent by Calvin as missionaries to Brazil! Both Calvin and the missionaries he trained ended up planting 2,150 churches in France by 1562, just

two years before Calvin died. This missionary school wasn't just something Calvin had attached to his name. He personally trained, did assessments, wrote letters to missionaries, and prayed with them.

While John Calvin is often thought of as the theological mind of the Reformation. the truth that his doctrine is stretched beyond his head and his books and into his heart and his boots. That is what theology should always do. What we know and love about God should fuel our love for others and our boldness to give the gospel. This November, I will be leading a four-week Wednesday night study of evangelism. I want to invite you to join me. Let's learn together to do what good Calvinists do share the gospel. Blessings to you all, and happy reformation month!

It is a seminal work that has shaped Christian theology through the ages. Is it dense and hard to read? Yes. Is it worth it? Yes! To this day, whenever I have a pressing theological question, I will still thumb through the Institutes to see what Calvin had to say. And I am always shocked at how insightful he can be despite having written in the 1500s.

#### UPDATE FROM JENNY COON





#### Hello,

I just wanted to send a quick update as many of you are likely watching what is happening in Beirut on the news. The "war" that I had mostly been living on the fringe and second hand through the stories of patients and helping the scores of refugees / displaced that came from the south/east into my community finally arrived on my doorstep. As a friend said, "Beirut's turn finally came." Although I am "safe" in my neighborhood, I was up with most of Beirut the whole night as the bombs fell one after another in the southern suburbs, just a few miles away. Hearing, feeling, watching the city you love under attack is not something I can not adequately put into words.

We don't know what comes next at this point. Balassan, the

church, and myself appreciate vour prayers for wisdom in how

to help and healing for all of our hearts, bodies, and souls. The level of trauma and destruction over the past week is too much to bear. We are angry, sad, grieving, worried, and so much more. I am grateful for my community here and going through this together with them. I know God is with us and even in the midst of this, I can see Him at work in ways I can share in a later update.

Over the past week, I have focused on treating my ever growing number of patients, coordinating on behalf of Balassan with our pastor and our medical doctor on ways that we can help with the refugees, co-ordinate trauma trainings with our social worker, and resource diapers/mattresses/ milk to the family members of our patients from the south/east. I will send more of what that practically looks like in a later update.

Today, I am leaving Beirut in God's hands and taking a break so I can be ready for what next week holds.

Thank you for your prayers and for your concern. I know many of you have been asking how to pray. For now, the best I can say is pray for peace.

Thanks for checking in. I appreciate It has certainly been a rough week. Where I live in Beirut is technically safe, but we are receiving lots of refugees from parts of the country that are being bombed. I have been busy both treating patients and coordinating at the clinic to help those displaced. As always in these situations you see the best and worst of people. I can speak for myself and the local church here that we ask for prayer for wisdom in how to help, how to care well for those who have lost loved ones and homes, and that God would use this displacement of people to bring them to Himself.
