

Mission of the Month

Homeless Outreach

Each Sunday, homeless people, many coming from the county shelter and the county jail, attend worship service and Bible study in NW Atlanta.

Fish House Recovery Program

The "Fish House," a ministry of Jesus Place Inner City Mission, is a 6-12 month program designed to encourage, equip and disciple homeless men with the goals of achieving quality employment, housing, restoration to family and active membership in a local church body. Clients are studying basic Christian doctrine, actively participating in church, restoring relationships, and developing their careers all while maintaining sobriety in this very vital program. Our motto is "Fishing for Men, Equipping Men to Fish."

Tri-Cities Food Cooperative Program

In collaboration with Tri-Cities Church, Fulton Co. Schools social workers, and the Atlanta Community Food Bank, Jesus Place offers a food security ministry weekly. Families in need are identified through the social workers who join the co-op and food is distributed to these families. Each cooperative meets twice a month. Throughout a year, the food cooperative program distributes over 40 tons of food. Food security stabilizes families in schools that experience nearly 50% attrition rates.



This month we're asking you to donate empty backpacks for their homeless outreach ministry, this is the one item they are always short on. They are requesting darker colors. Place any donations in the donation box at the back of the sanctuary.

Living in Lebanon

News from Jenny Coon



We were able to help one of the displaced with a prosthetic limb! This man's heart is also open to hearing more about our faith and we hope to visit him with Pastor Andrew in the near future. Keep him in your prayers!

Marhaba,

Yesterday marked my 5th year anniversary in Lebanon! It has sometimes felt like a roller coaster, but I am grateful for what God has done and is continuing to do in my heart and in the ministry here in Lebanon. A huge thanks to all of you who have faithfully prayed, supported, and encouraged me through this journey!

This past week, we had some funds left designated for Disaster Relief / internally displaced people so we purchased some food and cleaning "essentials" for remaining displaced families that we have been investing in at Balassan Clinic. As I was helping distribute these, their responses were overwhelming. "I had no idea what to feed my family today." "You have stood by us and helped us with all of our needs. No one has stood by us like you have." "I just came out from the hospital and my girls are selling water on the street because I don't have any other option for food or drink." Sometimes I wish I could jump in a bulldozer and start pushing away rubble or had the funds to rebuild houses, or could talk some sense into those that perpetrated and continue to perpetrate the hostilities. But I am grateful that these "small" acts of kindness that our clinic and church are able to do has a lasting personal impact on these families that God has given us.

Thank you for your prayers for the Syrian woman that I mentioned last month who has started to read the Bible with us. She told me recently that she is struggling to believe what is happening inside of her. She said "it is as if sometimes I do not recognize myself" (referring to feelings of peace instead of anger and fear)." After some very encouraging signs and conversations, this past week has been a little discouraging. Continue to keep her in your prayers as God works on her heart.
