

The Christian Women's Center W.O.W. program is a 12 month discipleship program that offers refuge to women in crisis believing these women can be restored to physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being through the love of Christ. The crisis could be abuse, prostitution, neglect, homelessness or any combination resulting from drug or alcohol addiction. We help women achieve life change by demonstrating to them the love of Christ through unconditional love and acceptance. We provide one-on-one biblical counseling, group addictions counseling, career readiness classes, health screenings, parenting instruction (as needed), life skills, Bible studies, opportunities to volunteer, wellness education/exercise and partnerships with community services for our residents.

The acronym, WOW, stands for Women of the Well and refers to the story of how Jesus met a woman at Jacob's well and told her everything she had ever done. She was stunned that He would even talk to her. Then, Jesus tells her He could offer her "living water" and she'll never go thirsty again. The "living water" represented eternal life that she could only get through belief in Him. She doesn't fully comprehend until He tells her that He is the promised Messiah! (John 4:4-30)

Missonary Update

Firmly Rooted, Living in Lebanon

Marhaba,



It is hard to hold back my excitement in writing this update. As many of you know, God gave me a word 10 years ago looking across the border into Syr@a to come and serve Him in this region, and particularly the people of that country. After several failed attempts, and occasional lack of patience on my part, the answer always remained, "wait." However, this past week, God opened all the doors and I went with a local pastor and some of my Balassan team to spend 2 days in the capital city exploring a potential ministry opportunity with a local church to help them open a medical center similar to Balassan! The border process went smoothly and God was clearly with us each step of the way. A clear reminder that His timing is always best. We spent hours in discussion with the local pastor, his wife, and team about the current challenges in their church, community, and country, as well as listening to miracle after miracle of how God has continued to provide and sustain them and even grow their community in spite of immense hardships and suffering. Their vision is to reach M@slims in their community, and particularly the ones who are living in a nearby area which was decimated with chemical bombs, yet they live in the rubble as they can not afford rents anywhere else. Their small, simple church is packed every week without an empty seat. People living on one meal a day sometimes skip a meal, just in order to pay for the transportation for another family to make it to church. Electricity only comes one hour a day and they are often without water. They are tired, burnt out from war and trauma, and feel alone in many ways. The whole time I was with them, I just wanted to encourage them and love them.

We also got to tour the old capital city and see some historic and Biblical sites.

What are the next steps? What does this mean for me personally? Although there is a very real opportunity for Balassan to partner with them to open a clinic, and the current visa situation allows me to travel back and forth, there are many challenges and logistics that would need to be worked out. Funding is also a huge issue. Political unrest and instability with constantly changing security situations are also a concern. I appreciate your prayers as I work through these issues and questions with my local community and team, supporting churches, and leadership.

Unfortunately the woman who we had been praying and reading the Word has disappeared and likely returned to her previous husband. We have not had contact with her in nearly a month. Continue to keep her in your prayers as well.
