
Session News

The date for the May regular Session meeting has not been determined but will be set for early May.





PORTRAIT OF A CHURCH PLANTER

A very perceptive question that I have been asked more than once by ministry partners (like yourselves) is, "What have you learned from pastors and leaders in the majority world?" That is, "Grady, you travel as an Instructor, but what are your students teaching YOU?"



My first response is always, "Latin Americans know how to plant churches. They just DO IT." Church leaders identify a community with no evangelical witness, and they go and start having meetings and doing ministry, they start gathering people, and as soon as possible, they organize a new congregation.

With that in mind, let me introduce you to Pastora Irma, pictured above, in Limon, CR. First of all, I have to mention the caveat that Timothy Two teaches a "complementarian" theology of the role of men and women in the church. Nonetheless, we don't restrict ourselves "on the ground." We recognize that women play a vital role in the majority world church, and we meet them where they are.

Having said that, I chatted with Irma during a workshop break - her English is perfect! - and asked about her current ministry. "I'm planting another church," she replied. Irma, a feisty 72 year old retired school teacher, is now planting her 6th church in Limon. The Lord led her to another neighborhood without a church. She started going on Wednesday evenings and gathering kids for children's ministry, and through the children, meeting parents and others. The Lord has provided a place to meet (a community center), and an empty lot abandoned by someone who left town during the Covid crisis, where they intend to build their own facility.

As we talked, I came to understand a dynamic in the Limon workshop that I had not realized during the many days we have been together in the last two years. Actually 3 other pastors in the workshop - 2 men and 1 woman - are pastoring 3 of the congregations Irma has planted. One of those pastors, Pastor Shester, was not able to stay for the second and third days of the March workshop (and sadly, wasn't there to graduate either), because he had flown over to San Salvador, El Salvador, to work with leaders there organizing a new church in that city and country. Let that sink in. For the little grandma pictured above, that's a 3rd generation church plant.

Pastora Irma is an artist as well as a schoolteacher and church planter, and as a parting gift she gave me the eagle pictured above (painted on wood, with a hanger) which I happily display in my office. "Remember the lesson of the eagle," she said. "Either spread your wings and fly, or flap around in the dirt and die."
