# Session News

The August Session meeting was held on August 11 at the church at 5:30pm.

For the devotion, the Session read and discussed Chapter 11 of the Westminster Confession. The Session then voted to move monthly Session meetings from Thursdays to Mondays. Teaching Elder John Cleveland shared an update on missionaries Santosh and Shiny John, who recently experienced personal hardships. The Session agreed to ask for the congregation's support in collecting a love offering which would be given to the family on Sunday, August 31. The Session also reviewed the roles of elder and deacon as described in Scripture and then held a discussion about how to more effectively delegate church needs and responsibilities between the two groups as well as improve communication. The Session concluded the meeting by revisiting the church's bylaws and identifying specific areas which need revision. The Session agreed that the church should contact the EPC for legal counsel before moving forward with any official changes.

Specific prayer needs were discussed and lifted to God.

The date for the September regular Session meeting has not been determined but will be set for early September.

# Missionary Update

Marhaba,

We are nearing the end of our Alpha course at Balassan. It has been a joy to walk with these women as we explore together various topics of our faith.



One of the ladies who is a refugee from Sudan expressed how she had always wanted to know who Jesus was, but never had an opportunity to ask, or explore the topic growing up in her village. She has come to our clinic for several years bringing her children to our pediatrician, but had never engaged much with our team. This all changed very recently when she was diagnosed with breast cancer. With no money to afford treatment, and no possibility of returning to her home country, she was desperate, scared, and felt alone. We began to pray with her for healing and in the process formed a close bond with her. When repeat scans were done to determine her exact treatment so we could start looking into funding sources, the cancer was gone. The doctors had no explanation. She looked at us with tears in her eyes and said that she knew Jesus had healed her. Soon after she was one of the first to sign up for Alpha and has faithfully come every week with the biggest smile on her face. Last week, she shared with us that her sister in Egypt had begun asking her questions as she saw that she was different and she too wanted to know more about this Jesus. She asked if I knew of any churches near her sister's neighborhood, and through the help of a friend we were able to find a Sudanese believer close by who has already begun meeting up with her!



As I mentioned previously, I had invited someone to do some basic sessions on trauma healing with my staff in June/July. The feedback was overwhelmingly supportive, so I continued in a "round table discussion" type format on a weekly

basis where I share some principles on trauma-informed care and what that means for us as a clinic in how we listen and communicate with our patients as well as with my background in neuroscience and chronic pain. It's been fun to dive deep together with our various backgrounds and educational levels and choose relevant topics together.

Update on Syr: As I mentioned in my last newsletter, I postponed my trip due to a terrorist attack on a near-by church and threats of potential further attacks. I then had to postpone it again this past month after clashes and hundreds killed in Suwayda directly and indirectly affects the Druze majority area that the church is located. Further complicating matters for a monthly ministry is a new visa fee at the border to be paid each trip. I continue to engage with the pastor (my connection) there frequently to encourage him and his family and pray together. Hopefully, the door will open to return again soon.

Balassan Clinic will celebrate our 5-year anniversary in October! Stay tuned for more details on that next month!
