





Session News

The December Session meeting was held on December 1 at the church at 5:30pm.

For the devotion, the Session read and discussed parts 1-3 of Chapter 15 of the Westminster Confession. The Session then reviewed a report from the church's social media manager Erin Evans highlighting social media analytics. In addition, a proposal was considered to expand the hours and duties of the social media manager to include creating blog and podcast content for the church's website. The proposal will be presented at the January 2026 budget meeting. Next, the Session approved an estimate from deacon Alan Dennis to repair roof leaks. The Session also approved a request from the Echols family to use church facilities to celebrate Skeet Echols' birthday on December 21 with a Varsity food truck. The Session then reviewed an updated edition of the new church bylaws presented by TE John Cleveland. The bylaws were approved and will be presented at the congregational meeting in January 2026. The Session then revisited the topic of installing security cameras in and around the church; a decision will be made pending approval of an estimate. The Session concluded the business portion of the meeting with updates on nominations for the offices of elder and deacon.

Specific prayer needs were discussed and lifted to God.

The date for the January budget meeting has been scheduled for January 5 at RE Keith Lovern's house. Elders and deacons will be present.

Equipping Christian Educators Across Europe

Last month, we welcomed Dr. Vishal Mangalwadi, apologist and historian from India and a featured speaker for the February 2026 RMC Conference. Together with EducaVie, ACSI, and RMC, we hosted two days of training for teachers and parents of Collège Daniel. Drawing from his book *The Book That Made Your World*, Dr. Mangalwadi explored how biblical truth has shaped world history and society, encouraging educators to confidently apply God's Word in their callings. We also began planning next year's conference and learned about Truthapedia, a new AI-based tool being developed to help Christian educators worldwide teach from a biblical worldview. Please pray for the pastors and teachers preparing to attend the 2026 RMC Conference and for continued unity and growth within our Collectif network in France.



Encouraging Christian School Leaders from Belarus

We also had the privilege of welcoming Teach Beyond Belarus' National Director and four Christian school leaders to France. Their visit offered mutual encouragement and a powerful reminder of the cost of Christian education in hostile environments. These schools operate under constant threat, often sheltered by churches and supported through great sacrifice. The Visuel Valet Podcast: Supporting Teachers

Through the Visuel Valet podcast, EducaVie continues to equip teachers across 42 Christian schools in France. A recent episode featured an interview with Patrick Schmidt, Director of the Daniel School, discussing The Visuel Valet by Dr. Harold Klassen. This resource helps teachers connect all subjects—literature, art, math, and more—to the biblical story of creation, fall, redemption, and restoration.
