








Session News

The 2026 church budget meeting was held on January 5 at 5:30 pm in the home of RE Keith Lovern. In attendance were all members of the Session, Deacons Alan Dennis and Cameron Dennis, and Financial Secretary Brooke Echols. Details of the church budget for 2026 were discussed and will be presented to the church membership for approval at the congregational meeting scheduled for Sunday, January 25, 2026. (Rescheduled to February 1, 2026, due to inclement weather)

The January Session meeting was held on January 12 at the church at 5:30 pm. For the devotion, the Session read and discussed parts 4-6 of Chapter 15 of the Westminster Confession. The Session then considered ideas for the next pastor's Bible study scheduled for late winter/early spring of 2026. The Session also reviewed the final details of the 2026 church budget as well as the final draft of the new church bylaws in preparation for their presentation to the church membership for approval at the congregational meeting scheduled for Sunday, January 25 (February 1). The Session then concluded discussions for nominations for the offices of elder and deacon. Frank Fraticelli and Bill Herndon will be presented for the office of ruling elder, and Jake Skelton will be presented for the office of deacon at the congregational meeting. Lastly, in light of consistent high attendance at Sunday morning worship, the Session discussed possible ideas to accommodate overflow should the sanctuary exceed capacity in the near future.

Specific prayer needs were discussed and lifted to God.

The date for the February Session meeting has been scheduled for February 2.


Missionary Update Living in Lebanon

Happy New Year!



We start out the new year at Balassan with a new doctor! A cardiologist who has recently returned from a neighboring country with her family has graciously offered to join our team and donate a couple days a month. She is highly respected from her time in Lebanon before, and personally I know her as an intelligent, caring, compassionate person and believer who will be a huge blessing to our team and our patients. Many people are unable to afford consultation fees for cardiologists, much less any further tests or medications so this will be a huge help for many.

Our Alpha group has restarted after the holidays, and we had a special time of individual prayer for each of the women.
